Mission

Youth Empowerment Performance Project (YEPP) seeks to provide a safe environment for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer youth experiencing homelessness to explore their history, investigate new ways to address their struggles and celebrate their strengths through self development, leadership development and community development programing that incorporate art-expression forms.

YEPP uses harm reduction, social justice, transformative and restorative justice, trauma-informed, and education for liberation (theatre of the oppressed and popular education) frameworks to contain and guide the work. As part of the work, we provide resource advocacy around housing, employment, educational, legal and health services, transportation, food, among many others.

General Description

The Services Support Specialist will be responsible for providing support for in-person participant service needs during the Community Drop-In Arts Program (C-DAP) such as: mutual aid donations shopping, food service, laundry and shower services, etc. The Services Support Specialist will support young people one on one with low threshold emotional support and de-escalation. Alongside direct service support and de-escalation, this role will oversee the administrative efforts around our food resources: outreach, on-boarding of food volunteers, and food distribution across programs.

Primary Tasks and Responsibilities

• Guide young people to access supportive services during Community Drop In Arts Program (C-DAP) such as: laundry and shower services, food, resource advocacy, mutual aid shopping, sleeping/rest area, programming, computer station, etc.

- Provide services such as serving food, provide orientation to new participants, supervise sleeping/rest area, support in providing laundry and shower services, etc.
- Support the Chicago Youth Mutual Aid (CYMA) closet tasks such as: support young people doing their shopping, keep the closet organized, inventory based tasks, etc.
- Complete administrative tasks such as: reception log, participants shopping forms, C-DAP briefing/de-briefing meetings log, supplies needs log, etc.
- Support young people one on one when low threshold emotional support is needed, as well as being prepared to assist in de-escalating conflict.
- Support programming efforts with tasks such as: workshop co-facilitation, setting up the space, holding space during the workshop, closing support, assisting facilitators, etc.
- Navigate outreach efforts to increase the food justice volunteers team
- On-board new food justice volunteers and provide the necessary supervision
- Attend needed professional development opportunities.
- Attend weekly staff meetings and supervision meetings.
- Perform other tasks as assigned.

Required Skills/Qualifications

- Experience working with LGBTQI+ youth
- Experience working with people experiencing homelessness or housing instability services/advocacy
- Experience with and commitment to trauma-informed and harm reduction models
- Experience in de-escalation methods and tools around physical and verbal altercations, as well as emotional crisis incidents.
- Commitment to transformative justice
- Commitment to working in a diverse environment in regards to race, ethnicity, culture, sexual orientation and gender
- Able to work both on and off-site and clearly communicate with supervisors about work progress.

Preferred Skills/Qualifications

- Bilingual (English/Spanish)
- Excellent verbal, writing, communication, and negotiation skills
- Ability to take initiative, be dependable, resourceful, pays attention to details while thriving in a fast-paced environment
- Ability to work on multiple projects effectively and efficiently independently and collaboratively
- Knowledge of criminal justice, public policy, and social justice issues around LGBTQI+ youth homelessness.

Additional Requirements:

All staff are expected to consistently act within the values and frameworks central to YEPP, and in keeping with the mission of YEPP. Staff must have an overall commitment to serving the participants of YEPP, and to contributing to a positive, respectful and accepting environment at YEPP.
